

INTERVIEW- ACADEMIC DIRECTOR

A CONVERSATION WITH OUR ACADEMIC DIRECTOR

Academic Director, Ms. Shashikala has 26 years of experience in the teaching profession. She has played the role of a concerned and committed Vice Principal in one of the reputed schools in twin cities, besides being a strong advocate of professionalism and compassion towards children in their growth. She is the epitome of Dedication, Determination and Dynamism.



Describe your most successful experience as an **Academic Director at DSE.**

At the beginning of this academic year, I had planned on systematizing the planning and documentation of the teaching learning process across all the three branches as; examinations will enable them to understand where they a priority. It gave me immense satisfaction to note that I was quite successful in achieving what I had set forth to do.

A variety of teaching methods are used to encourage imagination, creativity and critical thinking: How do you encourage the teachers to prepare for it?

Imagination, Creativity and Critical Thinking are the key skills every teacher must possess in order to be successful. I am very confident that if a teacher applies his/her mind to it, wonders can be created in a classroom. I guess my positive approach helps them to identify their own potential.

How do you assess a teacher both in Scholastic and Co Scholastic areas?

Both these components are two different aspects of teaching; yet similar. That being said, assessment of these is very subjective. The commonality between these two areas is the succinct communication techniques used by the teacher to align the two areas of learning. Systematic approach will enable a person to do justice to both. Except for Visual and Performing Arts, which is not everybody's cup of tea, I think the other aspects of coscholastic areas can easily be assessed.

In the present scenario, students lack moral values in them. What are your thoughts to inspire students towards moral refinement?

Moral values cannot be taught overnight to any student. They must be ingrained over a period of time. There is a two pronged approach to it. From childhood onwards, a child must be sensitized towards differentiating the right from the wrong by the parents. Subsequently, at school these values must be reinforced by the teacher all the time. Constantly talking to them and enabling a dialogue between the stakeholders will reap great rewards.

Government is reintroducing compulsory Class X Board examination for CBSE schools from the 2017 -18 academic year. What are your views on this?

I have mixed reactions to this. While compulsory Board stand in this competitive world, CCE pattern would have also helped to understand a child better, if the evaluation is done in its true sense.

Describe your vision for DSE Group of Institutions in the forthcoming years.

DSE Group of Institutions has a great future. Backed by strong management, state-of-the-art infrastructure and other facilities, it will surely emerge as a strong contender to many of the established institutions. It is already on the path of the progress and I am very confident the future goals will be achieved easily.

How do you keep yourself organized? Could you please share how you multitask?

For completing whatever be the task at hand, I visualize the ways and means of completing it. I am not a 'give-up' kind of a person. I like to tie up all the loose ends till the end is realized to my satisfaction. I do go haywire at times, but by and large, I am very composed during a crisis and this has helped me many a times. Time management also helps. More than anything else, I am a workaholic and I enjoy my work. That makes my job that much simpler.

How is the world today different from what it was like when you were a student?

Very cliché. We were very carefree during our student days. There was no cut throat competition for anything, yet, we managed to do well. In the absence of e-world in which the present generation is submerged, we were more outdoorish. Physical activities played a major role in moulding us. The experiential learning- the coinage term these days- was something very natural for us as students. Sometimes I feel very saddened at the thought that the present generation rarely steps out to do something unless pushed by someone. But I guess times moves on, and so does generation after generation. At least, the present generation is trying to achieve its goals.

Students are pressurised by their parents to either opt engineering or medicine. Due to this, students are unable to express their desire and achieve their dreams. What message would you give to such enthusiastic parents?

There are opportunities galore for the present generation. Both Aptitude and Attitude must be assessed for the students and the parents must be counselled to accept the desires of their children. Parents must

be very open-minded and not compare their child with anybody else's. This tremendously helps to boost the morale of the child.

How do you spend your free time?

Nothing much! Watching some shows and reading books I guess.

Which song is there in your mind the most often?

Nothing in particular. I am very fond of Beatles and their songs. Also old Hindi songs.

Your valuable message to the DSE Family in terms of taking the mantle of education forward.

Sincere and dedicated approach towards teaching and learning will enable our DSE to go forward effortlessly. My motto – 'Be a worker, not a shirker'.

SWAMI VIVEKANANDA - ADDRESS AT THE WORLD PARLIAMENT OF RELIGIONS




Vivekananda's speech at the World Parliament of Religions in Chicago, in which he introduced Hinduism to North America, became historical.

"Do I wish that the Christian would become Hindu? God forbid. Do I wish that the Hindu or Buddhist would become Christian? God forbid. The seed is put in the ground, and earth and air and water are placed around it. Does the seed become the earth, or the air, or the water? No. It becomes a plant, it develops after the law of its own growth, assimilates the air, the earth, and the water, converts them into plant substance, and grows into a plant. Similar is the case with religion. The Christian is not to become a Hindu or a Buddhist, nor a Hindu or a Buddhist to become a Christian. But each must assimilate the spirit of the others and yet preserve his individuality and grow according to his own law of growth."

MAHATMA GANDHI - QUIT INDIA SPEECH

The Speech delivered by Gandhi on August 8, 1942, addressed the A.I.C.C. at Mumbai (then Bombay) on the eve of quit India movement is considered one of his best speeches.

"Here is a mantra, a short one, that I give you. You may imprint it on your hearts and let every breath of yours give expression to it. The mantra is: 'Do or Die'. We shall either free India or die in the attempt; we shall not live to see the perpetuation of our slavery. Every true Congressman or woman will join the struggle with an inflexible determination not to remain alive to see the country in bondage and slavery. Let that be your pledge."

TEACHERS & PARENTS - A COLLECTIVE RESPONSIBILITY

In the present situation, there is a lot of emphasis on achievement and performance from the teachers and parents. As contemporary educationists rightly bring it forward that the focus of the current education system is on what the child doesn't know rather than on what the child knows. Original thinkers are often admired and valued for their novelty. If they seem a little spacey or eccentric, sometimes off in their own world, we often admire them to be different; call them a non-conformist and marvel at their creativity.

In a child, sadly these traits are often considered problematic. Parents worry if their child is forgetful, disorganised or easily side-tracked. They miss noticing the creative side and are uncomfortable with any such trait. By giving wings to the child's imagination and in the process, messing up everything around, we wonder if there's a learning disability or an attention deficit disorder. We often call them disruptive and uncooperative. These children are full of creative ideas but can't be bothered with details and the focus is somewhere else rather than what the rest of the class is focused on. They are happy and well liked but easily distracted. In such cases, sometimes kids start to go downhill in the earlier stage itself and may not keep up with the rest of the group while doing any activity. For a dreamer who typically connects to material through the senses, rote learning is tedious, as they tend to develop everything in their mind. Expressing the same may not be that easy and this is mistaken as a learning disability. Albert Einstein was considered unsociable, lazy and a daydreamer, who was not even able to have a coherent conversation. He failed the entrance of college and could not solve some of the simplest questions in school. History has proved that dreamers, dyslexic or for that matter slow learners, like Edison, Leonardo Da Vinci or Agatha Christie have proved to be great intellectuals.

The cautious part is that dreaming need not always be a part of creativity but an escape mechanism. Children caught up in a creative fantasy need more visual reminders. Discipline and behavioural changes needs to be checked incessantly and addressed on time.

The challenge and ultimate goal for adults is to help them see this behaviour as positive. Praising a child for effort rather than performance increases the likelihood that he will stay 'on task' longer. We need to work with a child's strengths rather than weakness. We need to be flexible while allowing a child to dream and let imaginations go wild but vigilant and be able to let them know when it is not practical.

ON THE OTHER HAND

Are Digital Schools the next big thing in the future?

With the chants of digitalization intensified more than ever in our country, a solid springboard has been set up in place just waiting to be used to propel its bearer up high. The only problem, as far as can be seen, is locating this springboard. It must be noted that digitalization encompasses various domains, out of which education is a long standing one. It's proximity with technology is considerable, but its reach is still limited. India, being one of the countries dabbling with pro-technological education, has stepped up the game with the current government's decision to go completely digital. Even though the current focus is more on making a cash-less economy, the education sector can carve out benefits of this scheme and implement innovative solutions to making the classroom more favourable learning environment. A case in point is the North Iredell Middle School, North Carolina, USA; where the student demographic, a mix of middle class rural and urban communities majorly, were given MacBook Airs as part of a \$20 million funding scheme in 2012, and their situation has only improved since then. They have had cases of students owning up to their assignments and homework's, just because of the laptops.

While the question "Are Digital Schools the next big thing in future?" is still thrown around, a kind reminder of an answer would have to be that the envisioned future is nowhere light years away, but rather is concealed deep within the present. The present jump in technological innovations has a large potential to change the education scenario of the country, but lack of a proper structure to implement the scheme on the larger level is what is holding back the aforementioned future. Educomp Tech, one of India's leading digital technological solutions provider boasts of providing to over tens of thousands of schools serving millions of students and is one of the major players in the industry. Looking at such ventures, there is hope that what was once a desert with sparingly scattered plants will turn into a rainforest soon. While there may not be a one to one correspondence between the state of North Carolina and India, scalability issues being a major problem, India could learn from the scheme by allocating more resources to implementing an organized way of spreading the digital light all over the country.

Teaching with technology can deepen student learning by supporting instructional objectives. However, it can be challenging to select the "best" tech tools while not losing sight of the goals for student learning. Once identified, integrating those tools can itself be a challenge albeit an eye-opening experience. Delhi School of Excellence, leaves no stone unturned to find creative and constructive ways to integrate technology into the class.

And now they are ready to step into the world of glory.






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
