

GLORY THAT LASTS FOREVER...

'Opportunities don't happen, you create them'

One such creator is **Vishalini NC of Grade II** who is an enthusiastic learner and always looks for new ways to get involved. She seeks new challenges and tries to create innovative things.

This kind of nature helped Vishalini to achieve the title - The Youngest Patent Holder by India Book of Records 2022 for inventing "An Automatic Multi-Functional Life Rescue Flood House. She was bestowed with the Pradhan Mantri Rashtriya Bal Puraskar by the Prime Minister for her exceptional achievement in the field of innovation.

Kudos to Vishalini for coming up with such an incredible idea that can transform the society and help the

country.

Let's find out the secret of her success.

How did you get the idea of creating a rescue house?

One evening, when I was watching the news with my parents,

they were reading news on floods in the news channel. Listening to that, I was surprised that all houses, vehicles and properties were damaged by heavy floods. I was continually thinking why this was happening? Then, I asked my father if we could have a balloon kind of houses that float in the water to rescue people. My father appreciated the idea and with his guidance, I came up with inventing an 'Automatic Functional Life Rescue Flood House 'which can help prevent people from drowning during floods.

Who has inspired you?

My parents inspired me lot. (with a cute smile on her face)

- They have given me more space and time for doing things.
- They supported me a lot and shared their knowledge for completing this project.

• Foremost thing is, when I do anything wrong or commit a mistake, my parents do not scold me or warn me. Instead, they correct, encourage and suggest me to do the right things. My parents are my inspiration and my strength.

What were the difficulties you faced while working on this project?

I faced two challenges while working on this project... one is 'Durability' and another one is 'Power Supply'.

• When I started to design the flood house, I concentrated more on the safety because if the flood house gets damaged, people will drown in the water. So I desired to have more number of layers with different materials in the flood house. It is a house of at least three regions. All the three regions are separated by an air gap and each region will have two-layer air survival casing. These layers and regions will give more durability for the flood house.

• This lifesaving device automatically inflates and pops out during floods, and acts as a water floating device for the escaper. But, we need the power supply for this device to activate and there is a chance for not having electricity during floods. So I chose to have a battery for activating the flood house. Solar panel and pressure transducer can be used for energy harvesting.

How do you feel being the first youngest patent holder of India and also achieving the Bala Purushkar Award?

I am very happy to achieve the title "The Youngest Patent Holder of India" and it is a great honour for me to receive the Pradhan Mantri Rashtriya Bal Puraskar Award from Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

The credit goes to my parents and my teachers. I would like take this opportunity to thank my father

Dr. M Naresh kumar, my Mother Dr. R Chitra Kala, my teachers, my school Principal Mr Augustine Thomas and DSE Management for their continuous support and guidance.


How to make Fighting Pencils?


You need: Two pencil stubs and a small rubber band

How to make it:


- Tie the threads of equal length, to the four corners of the handkerchief.

DANCING EYES

You need: A sheet of paper, a carbon paper and a pencil.


How to make it:

You need: An old, used tennis or rubber ball and a marble. How to make it:


• Cut the ball into two halves. Press the top to make a dent. Place the marble in the dent and wait.


• After some time the marble shoots up into the air and the dent disappears.







• Comparison


Kids usually get annoyed when compared. Especially sibling comparison is an absolute 'NO NO. Let them surpass their own targets and set a new benchmark.





The primary training for Active Bleeding Control (ABC) Guru, an initiative collaborated by the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia and IDF (Indian Development Foundation) was organized for the Grade IX students on 23rd November, 2021. Road Traffic Injuries (RTI) are one of the toughest public health challenges confronting India. Simulation training of the community to stop the excessive bleeding and saving lives from road traffic injuries is a prerequisite today.

ABC is a multi-partner collaborative pilot program MME with government and private agencies who have taken the initiative to spread awareness. Many life-threatening accidents can get the initial help if the common public is acquainted with the required first-aid skills. The elementary teaching of simple techniques such as calling the ambulance, applying direct pressure and applying simple tourniquets to stop the bleeding can therefore save many lives.

To give our students the benefit of this life saving training programme, all the students of Grade IX have undergone the ABC Guru Training Programme, as a part of the SEWA Project. **'Train the trainer to be the help before the help arrives'** has become the axiom behind it.

THREE MAJOR BREAKTHROUGHS IN PHYSICS BY INDIANS

Raman effect:

The Raman effect was a phenomenon that was discovered by CV. Raman. The Raman Effect is the process of scattering of light particles by molecules of a medium. The scattering occurs due to a change in the wavelength of light as it enters the medium. When a beam of light travels through a dust-free, transparent chemical, a small fraction of the light emerges in directions other than where it should.

Chandrashekhar limit

Subramanyan Chandrashekhar, who was an Indian-American astrophysicist was awarded the Nobel prize in physics for his discovery and equations related to the "Chandrashekhar limit".

Chandrashekhar limit can be defined as the maximum mass of a stable white dwarf star (the final state of stars which can't become a neutron star or a black hole). The current value for the Chandrashekhar limit is 1.4 solar masses or 1.4 times the mass of the sun. In a nutshell, the Chandrashekhar limit is the final limit before a white dwarf can become a neutron star or a black hole.

Bose- Einstein condensate

The Bose–Einstein condensate is a newly discovered state of matter that is typically formed when a gas of bosons (an elementary particle) at low densities is cooled to temperatures very close to absolute zero (lowest possible temperature- 0 kelvin). Under such conditions, a large fraction of bosons occupy the lowest quantum state, at which point microscopic quantum mechanical phenomena become apparent macroscopically. A BEC is formed by cooling a gas of extremely low density (about 100,000 times less dense than normal air) to ultra-low temperatures. This phenomenon was discovered by Satyendra Nath Bose, and was later modified by Einstein, which is why it is called the "Bose– Einstein condensate".



MAKE FOR INDIA VS MAKE IN INDIA

Make in India, as stated previously, takes cues from export-oriented growth. Leveraging the cheap labour and other resources to keep costs low will boost exports to strengthen the domestic production base.

On the other hand, Make for India entails production for consumption in India itself. Given that India is one of the largest consumer markets, the concept of "Make for India" could be a gamechanger. Not only does it make our growth independent of the international economic scene, this helps to take care of India's specific needs in view of high poverty levels in the country. It builds upon the idea of creating a symbiotic production-consumption cycle in India itself.

The difference between the two can be explained with an instance. Say, India exports leather goods. Now the demand for such goods depends on the economic situation of importing countries which, as of now, do not have good economic prospects. As a result, the leather industry becomes vulnerable to international markets. However, if those goods were produced for Indian consumers, many hitherto poor consumers will now be interested in buying more things. This may be more sustainable in the long run.

Another crucial difference between the two lies in the focus area. Make in India will be geared on "manufacturing" as a prime moving force while Make for India may or may not be solely based on "export-styled manufacturing". This sectoral favouritism for high growth may not be viable given the state of our manufacturing units.

In India, Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME) sector is the most labour intensive industrial segment. Reports by OECD assert that 65% manufacturing employment stems from these MSME units. Hopes of Make in India hinge on this sector.

But the MSME sector's labour productivity is low. If this sector were chosen as a key pillar of growth by giving parental allocation of resources and credit, it just might end up in a towering number of large inefficient units. This might further stress the already stressed banks who are reeling under the high Non-Performing Assets(NPA's).

Make in India also smacks of the old Import Substitution Industrialization. That experiment failed, but it still inspires Indian policy-makers to make the same old mistake again. This is based on production economics rather than consumption economics. In this epoch of internationalization of production, producing for import substitution might not be doable. It would be far easier to hack into global chains and be a part of a larger process rather than creating a secluded zone of production.


WAYS TO CONTROL POLLUTION IN DELHI

Jillian Wala Bagh

Jallianwala Bagh is located in Punjab. It was one of the crucial centers of the freedom struggle. The Jallianwala Bagh massacre took place on 13th April 1919.Jallianwala Bagh, a place that was rocked by the shrieks of hundreds of innocent people. Approximately 1650 rounds were fired on innocent crowds. The Jallianwala Bagh incident is regarded as a turning point in the freedom struggle of India.

Chauri- Chaura

Chauri Chaura is present in Uttar Pradesh, and is famous for the Chauri-Chaura incident. In the Chauri Chaura incident, the police first killed several peaceful demonstrators, and later an angry mob set an entire police station on fire thereby killing 22 policemen. After the Chauri Chaura incident, Gandhiji called off the non-cooperation movement because he thought that the movement had lost its non-violent nature. Bombay is now called Mumbai and it is the capital city of Maharashtra. The foundation of the Indian national congress in 1885 was one of the most important political events that took place in Bombay. The quit India movement was launched from Bombay in 1942 by Mahatma Gandhi. The city played an important role in the Indian independence movement.

Barrackpore

Barrackpore is in west Bengal. The famous rebellion of 1857 started from Barrackpore. Mangal Pandey declared war against his commanders. In the Barrackpore Indian sepoys revolted against British officers. This sparked off the first war of independence.

Jhansi

The spark of the sepoy mutiny reached Jhansi. The city of Jhansi, also known as the city of Rani Lakshmi Bai, is located in Uttar Pradesh. Britishers annexed the princely state of Jhansi under the policy of "Doctrine of Lapse" thereby refusing to adopt the son of Rani as heir to the throne.

Dandi

Dandi March or Dandi Satyagraha was a nonviolent protest against the British monopoly on salt production that was initiated by Mahatma Gandhi on March 12, 1930.He led the historical Dandi March from Sabarmati Ashram in Gujarat's Ahmedabad to the village of Dandi in the state's coastal area. It took him 24 days to reach Dandi.

A TRAVELOGUE TO HISTORIC PLACES IN MUMBAI

On a recent visit to one of the happening cities of India- Mumbai, "The city that never sleeps," we went to see some places of historic importance.

We started off with a new attraction of Penguins in India!! It was situated in Rani baug (local name). The actual name of the place is Veer Mata Jijabai Bhosale Udyan and Zoo which was spread over 50 acres of land and was the home to a variety of flora and



fauna. We saw many animals such as elephants, different kinds of deers, hippos, giraffes and beautiful birds. The main attraction- the penguins- were kept in a separate building which simulated their natural habitat. These are called Humboldt penguins and are very cute to look at.

Before exiting the zoo, we found a unique building and it was called the Dr. Bhau Daji Lad Museum. When we entered, we were excited to see a beautiful depiction of the history and rich heritage of Mumbai and its people. Also, you will find clay models, photographs and books too, showing Bombay (old name of Mumbai) from the late 18th to early 20th century. It is one of the oldest museums in Mumbai built in 1855.

Next day, we went to Mani Bhavan where Mahatma Gandhi spent a major part of his life. It is an old 2 storeyed building which shows his personal collections and his belongings. Most important of which is the iconic charkha which he used to make khaadi cloth using cotton.

There were also clay models and miniatures kept in glass boxes showing different events of his life from birth to death.



It was truly inspiring to see how he lived a simple life and yet had an impact on the Britishers to give us independence by following the path of non-violence. Our next stop was the Monetory Museum of the Reserve Bank of India. It has a beautiful display of how business was done in olden days and how currency came into use. It has a rare collection of currencies of all the dynasties which ruled in India. It also shows how currency developed and evolved to the current state. It also shows the different Governors of the Reserve Bank of India till date. It is guarded by security and photography is not allowed inside the museum. While we are celebrating the 75th Independence or Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav it is very important to visit such places that inspire us to see and learn how much our previous generations have struggled to give us

the peace and freedom which we are enjoying. A big salute to the people of Mumbai (both rich and poor) who come from different parts of the country, different backgrounds and religions and make it their home and strive hard to earn a living. Yet when faced with calamities natural and manmade, terror attacks etc. they get shaken up but the very next day they are back to their work.
